Re: Region G Water Demand Projections

I would like to take this opportunity to thank you for your assistance and diligence in having the City of Cleburne's future water demands recognized by the Texas Water Development Board (TWDB). The Municipal demands posted on the Region G web site were increased significantly from the Draft version of the Plan and appear to be adequate to meet the City's future needs. However, there are several issues which still need to be addressed. These would include the Steam-Electric, and the Irrigation categories as shown in the Johnson County Water Demand table on the Region G web site. These categories were not included in the draft plan which generated my response letter dated June 11, 2003.

The City of Cleburne currently has a 240 Ac-ft/year irrigation water right in Lake Pat Cleburne. This water is used to irrigate the city-owned golf course adjacent to the lake and needs to be included as a water demand for the City of Cleburne.

The City also supplies potable water and direct reuse wastewater to an electric power generation plant (Ponderosa Pine Energy). Our records indicate Ponderosa's annual consumption history is as follows:

These demands were included as part of the Industrial usage submitted in my letter dated June 11. Since the Manufacturing figures posted on the web site were not increased as requested and are still approximately 350 ac-ft

below actual consumption, the City requests that these amounts be added in the Steam-Electric category in addition to the Manufacturing demands currently in the Region G plan for Johnson County.

The City of Cleburne respectfully requests that a Steam-Electric demand of 1200 ac-ft/yr and an Irrigation demand of 240 ac-ft/yr be included in the final draft of the Region G Water Plan for Johnson County.
