

*The Coryell County Commissioners Court convened at 9:00 a.m. with all members in attendance. County Judge John Firth presided over the meeting.*

- 1. County Judge John Firth called the meeting to order.*
- 2. County Judge John Firth led the invocation.*
- 3. County Judge John Firth led the pledge to the American and the Texas Flags.*
- 4. Citizen's Forum:N/A*
- 5. Minutes for April 6, 2010 were approved after a motion by Commissioner Elizabeth Taylor and a second by Commissioner Daren Moore.*
- 6. A Mutual Aid Agreement with Coryell Memorial Healthcare System for the use of the Coryell County Activities Complex as an emergency medical treatment center was approved after a motion by Commissioner Elizabeth Taylor and a second by Commissioner Jack Wall. (Attached)*
- 7. The presentation "Sharing the Vision", as the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department's response to the Governor's request for a 5% budget reduction was presented by Leah Huth.(Attachment)*
- 8. Central Texas Council of Governments Executive Director, Jim Reed spoke to the court regarding the Public Safety Answering Points (PSAP). Mr Reed explained current budget cuts would require CTCOG to consider a change in where the PSAPs are currently located and how many PSAPs there will be under the new system. He explained that they would like to work with all parties involved to implement the best system at the lowest cost. (Attachment)*
- 9. Veterans Service Officer Pat Chesser informed the court he had dealt with 44 Veterans cases and resolved 65% in favor of the veterans. He stated that he is now taking calls from surrounding counties until they have a Veterans Service Officer in place. Judge Firth explained that the County will furnished office space in the MHMR building.*
- 10. The Coryell County Resolution 2010-4 designating the month of April as "County Government Month" was approved after motion by Commissioner Don Jones and a second by Commissioner Elizabeth Taylor. (Attached)*
- 11. The "Interlocal Cooperation Agreement" with the Limestone County Detention Center was approved after a motion by Commissioner Jack Wall and a second by Commissioner Daren Moore. (Attached)*

12. The Coryell County Resolution 2010-5 supporting the future implementation of a Tax Incentive Reinvestment Zone adjacent to the Eastern end of a Southeastern Copperas Cove bypass of U.S. 190 for the purpose of supporting a Copperas Cove Pass-Through financing application with the State of Texas was approved after a motion by Commissioner Jack Wall and a second by Commissioner Don Jones. 13. The 2010 Census in Coryell County was discussed with Judge Firth requesting that citizens who had not received the form should pick up one at the local Library.

14. The Army Corps of Engineers action to consider a Leon River mitigation bank (aka Fall-Off Creek Mitigation Bank) was discussed with location described as CR 344 to Mother Neff State Park. (Attachment)

15. The court voted to approve an additional amount not to exceed \$1,300.00 to be paid to Engineer Joe Morrison for a flood plain study of the Mound, Texas area after a motion by Commissioner Don Jones and a second by Commissioner Elizabeth Taylor.


To Whom It May Concern:






Dear Ms. Clark:
